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Science of Implementation

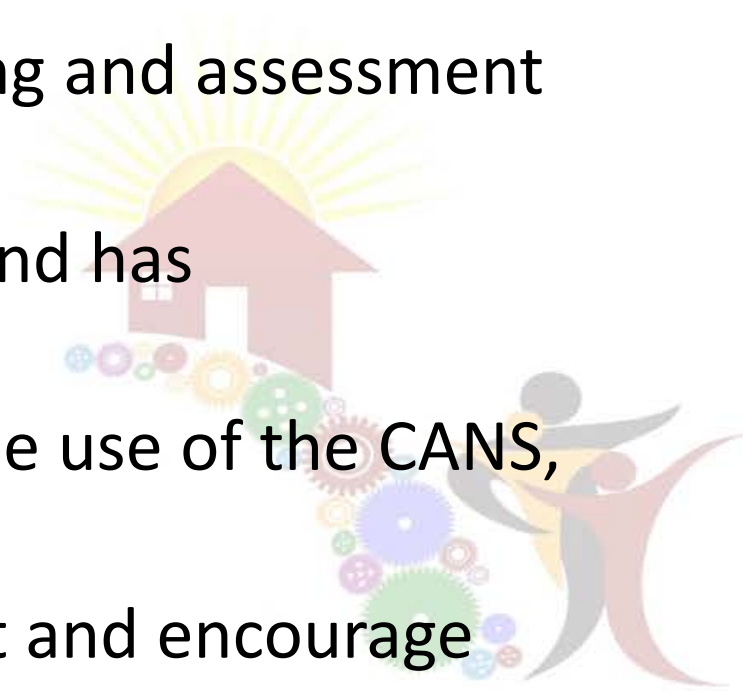
- Phase 1: Engagement

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Integration and Sustainability

- Statewide implementation of standardized screening and assessment for children entering out-of-home care
- Federal grant funding ended September 30, 2018 and has transitioned to Kentucky's CHFS for
- Continued focus on supporting providers around the use of the CANS, as well as meeting timeframes
- Training providers to use reports to drive treatment and encourage person-centered care
